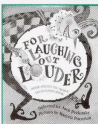

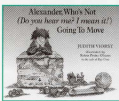

### Alexander, Who's Not (Do you hear that? I mean it!) Going to Move

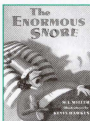
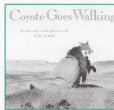
